I normally never say "buy one camera over another," but this is unusual in how small it is, the fact that it shoots RAW files and how great the final images are (assuming you use it at slower ISO speeds.). It has not replaced my "working" cameras but it goes with me when it is not practical to bring the bigger machines.
