In terms of new podcasts on The Wells Point, I recently posted:

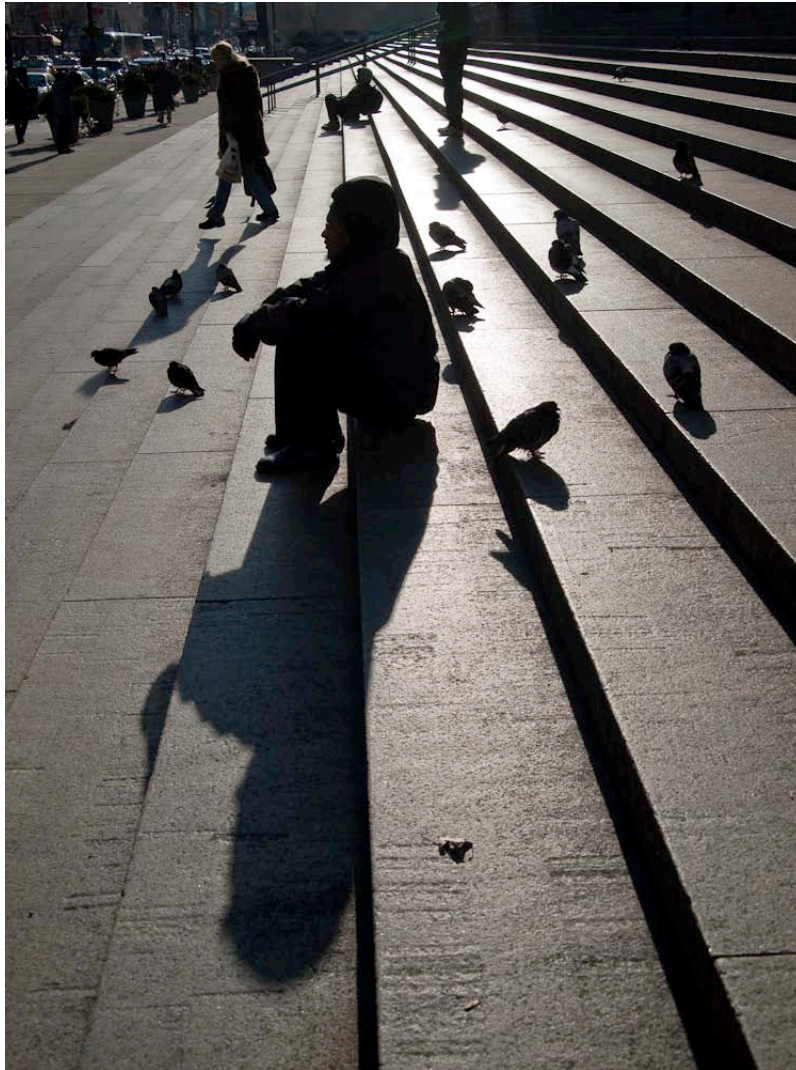
- A process oriented pod cast titled: Using different shutter speeds to show motion or stop action.
